## Donor Spotlight — The Corrigan's' Gift Gives Back

Former Coral Gables Mayor George M. Corrigan believes that Baptist Health South Florida is an “organization doing everything right.” Therefore, he and his wife Anna Mae decided to reward Baptist Health — and themselves — by making a substantial charitable annuity gift to Baptist Health Foundation. Their

gift was designated for the South Miami Heart Center and the Center for Excellence in Nursing.

Mr. Corrigan, the City Beautiful's mayor from 1987 to 1993, understands better than most exactly how well Baptist Health serves community needs. He is a member of Baptist Health's Board of Trustees, for which he heads up the Finance and Insurance Committee, and occupies seats on the Audit and Compliance and Investment Review Committees. And he continues to serve today, as he has for an astonishing three decades, on the South Miami Hospital board, for which he is currently secretary-treasurer.

The Corrigan's have given their gift in the form of appreciated stock, part of which the Foundation invests in an annuity that directly benefits the couple. Mr. Corrigan says that every February, he and his wife will receive what he calls a “rebate check” for an amount much higher than had they sold the stock and invested the proceeds in an income-producing certificate of deposit.

If he dies first, Mrs. Corrigan will continue to receive annual payments throughout her lifetime. “If we live long enough, this won't cost us anything,” added the 80-year-old with a characteristic tinge of optimism.

“As a business decision, this makes sense,” he said. Mr. Corrigan holds a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Miami. He spent 32 years with Federated Department Stores, retiring as manager of the Jordan Marsh store at Dadeland. His financial analysis skills were further honed as founding board member, president and chairman of the Bank of Coral Gables.

The Corrigan's also benefit because their donation of appreciated stock does not trigger adverse tax consequences. Had the Corrigan's made a gift of

appreciated property, the same principle would have applied.

But clearly, what drove the Corrigan's' decision most was the opportunity to “feel good about ourselves” by giving something back to the community.

“I should have done this a long time ago,” Mr. Corrigan stated. “Board members have a financial obligation.”

Most importantly, these counselors will provide emotional support to breast cancer patients from the moment of diagnosis and throughout the medical journey. The target opening date is early 2009.

# Arabian Nights Lead to Healthier Days for Patients with Blood Diseases

Virtual tourism and philanthropy hit the spotlight as more than 600 guests enjoyed an Arabian Nights-themed evening at South Miami Hospital's annual fundraising event. Held on March 15, the 48th annual Mercury Ball raised a record-breaking \$200,000 for the establishment of South Miami Hospital's Umbilical Cord Blood Collection Center, the first in the region.

With accents of Middle Eastern food, rich Arabian decor and entertainment by belly dancers, the event took place at the Doral Golf Resort & Spa. Patricia Birch chaired the ball, along with co-chairs Zeina and Ghassan Haddad, M.D.

Each year the ball is organized by the South Miami Hospital Associates, a group of volunteer business leaders who serve as goodwill ambassadors and fundraisers for the hospital, and the South Miami Hospital Foundation, the fundraising arm of the hospital.

The Associates honored Baptist Health's Chief Operating Officer, D. Wayne Brackin, as the Person

of the Year, for his commitment to South Miami Hospital's services and community involvement. Mr. Brackin served as the hospital's chief executive officer for 12 years before he was promoted in 2007 to executive vice president and chief operating officer of Baptist Health.

TotalBank was the Presenting Sponsor of the ball. Other major sponsors included Kidz Medical Services, Inc., Limestone Hills Corporation, First National Bank of South Miami, Cardiovascular Medicine Associates, and Reiss, Kang & Burks, M.D., P.A.

The umbilical cord blood collection center will allow parents who give birth to babies at South Miami Hospital the option of donating their newborns' cord blood for use anywhere in the world. The idea originated from South Miami Hospital cardiologist Harry Aldrich, M.D., whose family faced difficulties while locating a bone marrow donor for his son, who was diagnosed with leukemia. Umbilical cord blood, which is often discarded as medical waste, can be transplanted into patients with blood disorders. Unlike bone marrow, donated cord blood generally does not have to exactly match the blood of the recipient. Therefore, donated cord blood is especially beneficial to ethnic minorities, who often have a difficult time finding bone marrow matches. Miami's diverse culture provides a rich source of cord blood for the world, according to Dr. Aldrich.
