Overview

Internet Point of Care (PoC) Learning is a method of structured, self-directed, online physician learning focusing on topics relevant to current clinical practice. The Baptist Health Continuing Medical Education (CME) Program values real-time learning and recognizes its impact on improving the delivery of patient care.

Upon completion of an Internet PoC Learning activity, the participant will have searched valid evidence-based online sources for practice recommendations and will have applied, or may plan to apply, the appropriate recommendations to patient care. The Internet PoC Learning activity includes a reflective process in which physicians document their clinical question, the sources consulted and the application to practice. The target audience includes physicians and other healthcare providers who participate in practice-based, self-directed online learning in support of specific patient care.

Educational Objectives

Upon completion of a Internet PoC Learning activity, participants should be better able to:

- Apply appropriate recommendations to patient care based on research of valid evidence-based sources.
- Participate in a reflective process that includes documentation of their clinical question, the sources consulted and the application to practice.
